The paper characterizes the set of all possible values for the number of lines determined by n points for n sufficiently large. For $\binom{k}{2} \leq (n-k)$, the lower bound of Kelly and Moser for the number of lines in a configuration with n-k collinear points is shown to be sharp and it is shown that all values between $M_{\min}(k)$ and $M_{\max}(k)$ are assumed with the exception of $M_{\max}-1$ and $M_{\rm max}-3$. Exact expressions are obtained for the lower end of the continuum of values leading down from $\binom{n}{2} - 4$. In particular, the best value of c =1 is obtained in Erdős' previous expression $cn^{3/2}$ for this lower end of the continuum.
